Figure 1: Perception of corruption, by institution - proportion that think most or all are corrupt




Figure 2: Perceived change in level of corruption over the past year




Figure 3: The most important problems the government should address




Figure 4: How well or badly is the current government fighting corruption in the government




Figure 5: Ordinary people can make a difference in the fight against corruption





Figure 6: The most effective thing an ordinary person can do to fight corruption




